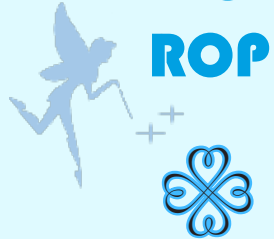

This course is designed to provide the student with entry level dental assisting skills. The student receives classroom instruction and clinical training in a dental office. Observing dental procedures enables the student to develop chair-side assisting abilities. Students receive information for career planning in schools of dentistry, hygiene and assisting. The student is encouraged to develop advanced knowledge of the dental profession after completion of this course while working as a dental assistant or by attending one of the colleges offering dental related instruction.

Program hours: 540 (two semesters) First semester students are trained in our Dental Careers Classroom, which has a lecture room, with simulated dental treatment rooms for training. Second semester students are on the job training at real dental facilities.
