D. INVITATION TO BARGAINING UNIT PRESIDENTS/DESIGNEES AND/OR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

- 1. Ms. Teri Lillywhite, Vice President of CSEA, welcomed the students and teachers back to in-person, hybrid instruction. She shared that their negotiations team met last Thursday and reached a tentative agreement on the conditions for re-opening school. They will be voting electronically. She gave a special thanks to the Administration's negotiations team including Mr. Tony DeVille, Mr. Robert Whittenberg, Mrs. Jane Benner, and Mrs. Marti Zizek for their work with CSEA members to reach an agreement.
- 2. Mrs. Stephanie Davis, President of the Faculty Association, shared that she understands that the Board of Trustees feels under enormous pressure as they make decisions that impact the health, safety, and well-being of our students and staff. She discussed her concerns with previously stated public comments regarding teaching and learning in the hybrid model. She commented that teachers are working very hard right now to ensure students are getting the best learning experiences possible.
- 3. Mr. Jeff Zeller, Union Mine High School teacher, highlighted the work of Ms. Brijette Bergman, Ms. Lisa Lamson, Ms. Megan Thomas, and Ms. Randie Zeiter-Smith who collaboratively teach the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) Program at Union Mine High School.

E. SUPERINTENDENT'S – ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. COVID-19 Opening in Hybrid Update.

Superintendent Carruth thanked all of the employees who have helped students succeed in the hybrid schedule. Teachers, instructional aides, nurses, counselors, maintenance teams, office staff, food service workers, technology team, bus drivers, and Administrators have all taken on new challenges and responsibilities to help schools open safely. He commented that it is a stressful time for everyone as things

are being done incredibly different and the learning curve is steep and challenging. The key for the District is to safely stay open; therefore, safety protocols need to continue to be priority number one. He thanked the entire District team for setting and enforcing expectations and recognized the amazing students as well. Superintendent Carruth stated that everyone needs to continue working together to keep everyone safe in the hybrid format. He shared that as we begin to move towards the fall, we enter the most reflective of seasons where we naturally begin to assess the many good things in our lives. There is so much to be discouraged about, but in this time of challenge, he is reminded to be thankful for the community that we live in and the working relationships that we have. We will find our way through this challenging time, but only so together. Thanks to the Board of Trustees and the work of all of the El Dorado Union High School District employees, our schools have successfully and safely opened in the hybrid model. He stated that the District will work diligently to do everything that we can to make this model work for our students, families, community, and employees.

1. 2019-2020 Advanced Placement Results.

Assistant Superintendent Christopher Moore reported that in order to encourage students to challenge themselves academically, develop college-level skills, be more competitive when applying for admission to postsecondary institutions, the Governing Board shall provide opportunities to high school students to take Advanced Placement (AP) courses and pass AP examinations.

Mr. Moore discussed the El Dorado Union High School District AP passing percentages at each school site. He advised that supporting student participation in AP courses and exposing students to additional academic rigor is consistent with our District's philosophy to increase college and career readiness. The AP results demonstrate that school-wide achievement is continuing its upward progress based upon the implementation of sound, research-based practices.

Mr. Moore advised that the District is committed to growing the AP program by exploring and identifying areas where students have interest and passion. Supporting student participation in AP courses and exposing students to additional academic rigor is consistent with our District's philosophy to increase college and career readiness.

The benefits of entering college with AP credits are clear. Advanced Placement students:

- are allowed to move into upper-level courses in their field of interest
- are more likely to graduate from college in four years
- qualify for scholarships

The Board thanked Mr. Moore for his report and acknowledged that the AP results demonstrate that school-wide achievement is continuing its upward progress based upon the implementation of sound, research-based practices.

Cabinet has done an amazing job orchestrating the move to the hybrid model, which is working quite well. She shared her appreciation for her fellow Board Members and that she is very proud of every employee in the District.

Mr. Del Rio:

• Mr. Del Rio commended his wife, who is a teacher, for working so hard in distance learning for her students. She had her first in-person day of instruction today and brought them candy. He stated that the Board knows how hard our teachers and staff are working.

Mr. Brown:

• Mr. Brown shared that the Board appreciates every employee in the District and Board Members share their appreciation for them every chance that they can. Board Members know how hard everyone is working during this very challenging year and we are all in this together.
