El Dorado Union High School District **EDUHSD Student Daily Symptom Checker**

Under order of the El Dorado County Public Health Officer, parents/guardians must perform a daily symptom check on their student(s) prior to students coming to school.

On a daily basis, please utilize the symptom checker located on the school and district websites or via the following link:

As a reminder, here are the symptoms for which you must check each day before sending your student(s) to school.

If the answer is "Yes" to any of the following questions, please keep your child home and contact your school Health Office for further guidance.

- Take your student(s) temperature. Is their temperature 100.4 F or above?
- Chills
- Persistent new or changed cough
- Shortness of breath
- Headache (new onset of severe headache with fever)
- Muscle pain/body aches/fatigue
- Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell/nasal congestion
- Nausea, vomiting and/or stomach pain
- Diarrhea
- Rash
- Red eyes
- Cracked or swollen lips
- Bright red or swollen tongue
- Swollen hands or feet
- Has your student been exposed to someone who tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?

By sending your student(s) to school, you affirm that you have answered "No" to all the above questions.

If the above symptoms are explained by another medical condition other than COVID-19, (e.g. asthma, allergies) please provide a note from your healthcare provider. Under these circumstances, your child may return to school if they have been cleared by their healthcare provider, their symptoms have improved, and they have not had a temperature while off all fever reducing medications (e.g. Tylenol, ibuprofen) for the last 24 hours.

If it is necessary for you to keep your child home for any of the above reasons, please contact your school health office so they can assist you in determining when your child can return to school.
