Oak Ridge students Vasanth Sadhasivan and Bernard Zhao recently teamed up with Ponderosa students Michael Grant and Sam Arcangle to participate in a project which involved creating an app to tackle conditions such as depression, anxiety, schizophrenia and autism during a seven week period. They displayed their project at CSU Sacramento in hopes of winning the attention of biotech industry representatives. Of the approximately 50 high school students who participated, their "Bloom" app took home first place. Student, Bernard Zhao, said "The app aims to make it easier for people with depression to get back on track with their daily routines by identifying activities that improve their moods. Users can note their diet, activities and moods in a given day, and the app will analyze that data to make suggestions for the future." Zhao continued by saying
