Fall Broadway Musical

Charles Schulz's beloved comic comes to life at Oak Ridge High School (ORHS) in Clark Gesner's classic musical, *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*. The whole gang is here: bossy Lucy is hopelessly in love with piano prodigy Schroeder who doesn't give her the time of day, perfectionist Sally is still mocking blanket-toting Linus, Snoopy is in the doghouse, and "blockhead," himself, Charlie Brown, is in rare form. Brief vignettes span the months from Valentine's Day to Beethoven Day, from wild optimism to utter despair. In this revised version, with additional music and lyrics by Andrew Lippa and dialogue by Michael Mayer, the sweet, joyful innocence of the Peanuts gang is maintained, but a fresh insouciance and playfulness is revealed. The new script features two new songs, particularly funny dialogue, and new, catchy orchestrations. Whether you're keen to fly with the Red Baron, moon over the Moonlight Sonata, or just do your best to find "Happiness," *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown* is a crowd-pleasing classic. For the first time in 18 years, El Dorado High School's (EDHS) Studio 81 is proudly presenting a double feature of the comedies *The Birds* and *Servant of Two Masters*. Paul Tomei's take on the ancient Greek classic, *The Birds*, is set in Cloud Cuckoo Land, a world somewhere between Heaven and Earth. It follows the story of two men fleeing from their politically conflicted home of Athens to the Kingdom of *The Birds* in search of finding a new place to live. *Servant of Two Masters*, is directed by Studio 81 alumni Gavin Sellers. Based on the Commedia Dell'arte comedy, originally written by Godoni in the early 19th Century, this adaptation takes place in the hairspray and legwarmer days of the 1980's in Alabama. A servant by the name of Tina is thrown between two powerful wrestling family rivalries, one Russian and one American.
