The upcoming school year will bring new leadership to two El Dorado Union High School District (EDUHSD) schools. Chas Prior and Paul Neville, both previous assistant principals at El Dorado High School, have moved up in ranks to assume their respective positions as principals at El Dorado High School (EDHS) and Union Mine High School (UMHS).

What he will miss the most is the direct contact with the students.

"It changes when you move to the principal position. I will still see the students, but not as frequently as an assistant principal does."

Prior's colleague, Paul Neville, has also transitioned out of his role as assistant principal at EDHS to fill the vacancy left at the UMHS principal's desk following Tony DeVille's shift to his role as assistant superintendent of human resources at the district office. Neville has been in the district for one year. He was a previous coach for three years and substitute teacher for one year at Rio Linda High School (Twin Rivers Unified School District) before establishing himself as a teacher, coach and assistant principal for a combined nine years at Amador High School (Amador County Unified School District).

Neville credits his career path to his parents.

"I witnessed the hard work and pride my parents took in working with young people," he said. "During my sophomore year in college I decided that I wanted to be an educator."

Neville said he will greatly miss the connections with the staff and student body at EDHS, but he is excited about the opportunity for a new challenge.
