E. INVITATION TO BARGAINING UNIT PRESIDENTS/DESIGNEES AND/OR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO ADDRESS THE BOARD (GC54954.3)

She shared that they have received 610-policy approval from the CSEA field office for the 2021-22 contract openers and members are voting through September 21, 2021.

G. EDUCATIONAL SERVICES – ACTION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. <u>California Cadet Corps.</u>

Assistant Superintendent Christopher Moore introduced Dennis Sirkin who reported on the California Cadet Corps Program and how it can benefit student growth. The objectives are to develop leadership, citizenship, patriotism, promote academic excellence, encourage personal health and wellness, and teach basic military subjects. Cadet Corps is also an UC/CSU approved "G" elective.

2. Williams Act (Instructional Materials Survey).

Assistant Superintendent Christopher Moore reported that Education Code Section 60119 requires that local Governing Boards hold an annual public hearing and adopt a resolution stating whether each pupil in the LEA has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in English/language arts, mathematics, science, and history-social science aligned to content standards and consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the SBE. The Governing Board must also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in health and foreign language classes has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, and determine the availability of science laboratory equipment for high school science laboratory classes.

The Administration recommends that the Board of Trustees:

- (1) Conduct a public hearing to determine whether each pupil in each school in the District has, or will have prior to the end of the eighth week of school, sufficient standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials, or both, in each subject that are aligned to the academic content standards and are consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board:
- i. Mathematics
- ii. English/Language Arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program
- iii. History-Social Science
- iv. Science
- (2) As part of the hearing the Governing Board shall make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the State Board for those subjects. The Governing Board also shall determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades nine to twelve, inclusive.
- (3) Approve Resolution #2021/2022-03.

Mr. Del Rio opened up for public comment in a public hearing. There being no comments, the hearing was closed. In absence of comments from Board Members, Mrs. Veerkamp moved to approve Resolution #2021/2022-03 stating that each pupil in the LEA has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials in English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and History-Social Science aligned to content standards and consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the SBE, and that each pupil enrolled in health and foreign language classes has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, and the availability of science laboratory equipment for high school science laboratory classes. Mr. Brown seconded. Motion unanimously carried (4-0).

1. <u>Approval and Certification of the 2020-21 Unaudited Financial Report and Update to the 2021-22 Adopted Budget.</u>

Assistant Superintendent Robert Whittenberg reported that the financial records for fiscal year 2020-21 have been reviewed and closed for the year. Year ending balances have been calculated and are being brought forward to 2021-22. The changes described in the narratives of the 2020-21 Unaudited Actuals represent changes that have been identified since the Board of Trustees approved the adopted budget on June 10, 2021.

Assistant Superintendent Whittenberg shared that the District completed the year with an increase in our General Fund balance of \$6,962,039. This increase was more than the \$1,909,456 increase projected as "estimated actual" as part of the adopted budget for FY 2021-22. However, it should be noted this reflects the financial savings obtained from the shutdown of schools and should be considered one time savings.

The 2020-21 Unaudited Actuals reflect an unassigned fund balance of \$8,984,188. The 2021-22 Budget reflects an unassigned fund balance of \$12,396,532. These figures include a 3% reserve for economic uncertainties. It is important to note that the 2021-22 September Revised Budget includes substantial one time funding related to the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Mr. Brown moved to approve and certify the 2020-21 Unaudited Actuals and the Update to the 2021-22 Adopted Budget. Mrs. Veerkamp seconded. Motion carried (4-0).
