Re: COVID-19 Testing System for El Dorado County Schools and Districts

The El Dorado County Office of Education, in collaboration with El Dorado County Public Health, has set in place both a surveillance and responsive testing system to support schools and districts throughout the county.

While the system is still in development and will be operational later this month, two community testing sites are currently available for COVID testing, one at Lake Tahoe Community College and one at the Placerville Fairgrounds. Testing takes just a minute of a person's time. Results are returned between 2-4 days later and determine whether you had an active COVID-19 infection at the time you were tested.

There is no barrier to being tested. The cost is covered either by medical insurance or by the State if you are uninsured, and if someone is without identification, testing staff will generate a unique identifier number to allow the person tested to obtain results. The only requirement is an appointment. Walk-ins are not accepted.
