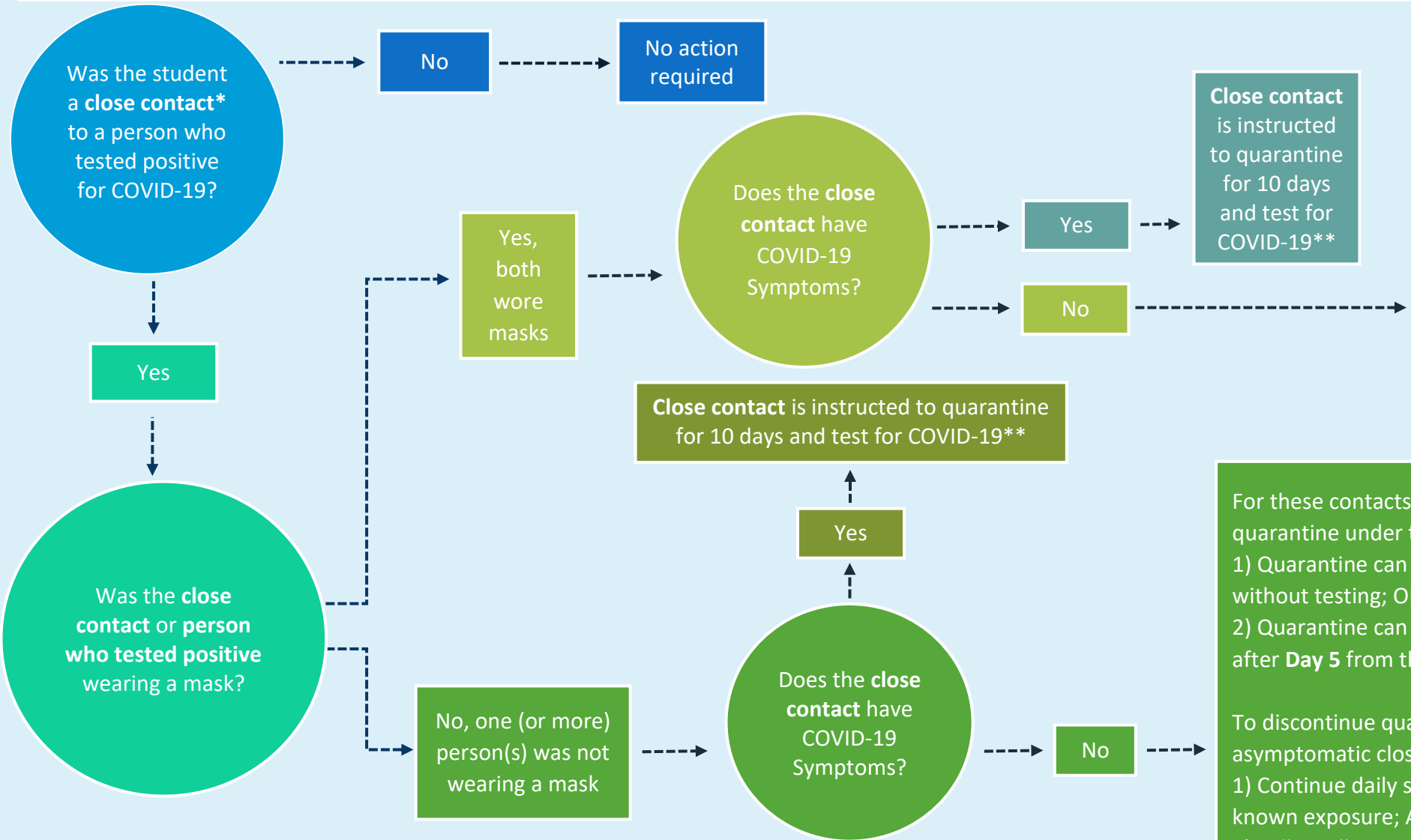


DECISION TREE: UNVACCINATED STUDENT EXPOSED TO A POSITIVE COVID-19 CASE IN AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION (K-12)



The student may adhere to a **10 Day Modified Quarantine**. They may continue to attend school for in-person instruction if they: are asymptomatic; continue to appropriately mask, as required; undergo at least twice weekly testing during the 10-day quarantine, testing should occur at least 3 days apart (Day 3 & 6); and continue to quarantine for all extracurricular activities at school, including sports, and activities within the community setting.

Quarantine can end after Day 7 if a diagnostic specimen is collected after Day 5 from the date of last exposure and tests negative, student may resume all activities.

For these contacts, those who remain asymptomatic may discontinue self-quarantine under the following conditions:

- 1) Quarantine can end after **Day 10** from the date of last exposure without testing; OR
- 2) Quarantine can end after **Day 7** if a diagnostic specimen is collected after **Day 5** from the date of last exposure and tests negative.

To discontinue quarantine before 14 days following last known exposure, asymptomatic close contacts must:

- 1) Continue daily self-monitoring for symptoms through **Day 14** from last known exposure; AND
- 2) Follow all recommended non-pharmaceutical interventions (e.g., wearing a mask when around others, hand washing, avoiding crowds) through Day 14 from last known exposure.***

***A close contact of a potentially infected student** is a student at the facility who was in close contact in the last 2 days (more than 15 minutes over a 24-hour period within 0-6 feet indoors) with a potentially infected student or had direct contact with bodily fluids/secretions from a potentially infected student.

****Exposure is confirmed** for the contact of the potentially infected student if the institution receives notification that the potentially infected student had a positive COVID-19 diagnostic viral test OR received a diagnosis of COVID-19 infection from a medical provider.

*******If any symptoms develop during this 14- day period, the exposed person must immediately isolate, get tested and contact their healthcare provider.
